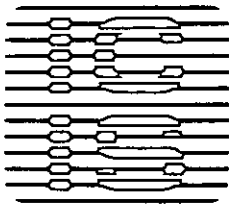

CALL FOR PAPERS

THE YEAR 2001: AN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ODYSSEY

The Program Committee of the International Conference on Information Systems (ICIS) invites the submission of papers to the Thirteenth Annual International Conference, to be held at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in downtown Dallas, December 13-16, 1992. All aspects of theory and research in information systems, as well as innovative methods of teaching information systems, are appropriate for the Conference.

The theme for ICIS'92 is "The Year 2001: An Information Technology Odyssey."

ICIS'92 will look ahead to the potential roles that Information Technology (IT) can play in business, society, and education as we enter the twenty-first century and showcase the research that will facilitate IT achieving these roles.

We encourage contributions focusing on the following subthemes:

- The nature of computer-based applications that might serve as delivery vehicles for education and training in the future.
- The use of IT to support the drive toward Total Quality Management in organizations.
- How best to manage IT within corporations that are moving towards global operations.
- Emerging approaches for managing information systems that set new directions for information systems research and/or practice.
- Horizon technology initiatives and their impact on organizations.
- The Role of IT in organizational change.

As in previous conferences, the Program Committee of ICIS'92 is soliciting papers that describe original research and proposals for panels that examine an innovative, controversial, or otherwise provocative issue of interest to the field. In addition, the Program Committee is soliciting descriptions of research-in-progress that will provide some insights into the challenges faced in the conduct of research as well as a first look at some promising results.

Research Papers

Submitted research papers should be original and should not be under publication consideration elsewhere. The Program Committee encourages papers that focus on the conference theme and that:

- employ novel theoretical, data collection, or analysis approaches
- question, expand, and/or provide interesting and creative perspectives on information systems research or practice
- provide theoretically based descriptions of experiences with information technology by individuals, groups, organizations, or governments

- make use of creative multi-institutional or multi-disciplinary research approaches

All research papers received by the submission deadline will be considered for presentation at the Conference. To ensure acceptance of high-quality papers, each paper submitted will be blind refereed by at least three qualified reviewers. All submissions will be reviewed promptly.

Panels

The Program Committee is soliciting proposals for panels that examine an innovative, controversial, or otherwise provocative issue of interest to the field. Proposals will be refereed. The panel should focus on a common theme and should not be a collection of work in progress. The best panels at previous conferences have often been structured as a debate, giving opportunity for audience participation. The Committee, however, welcomes new ideas for panels. Prospective Panel Chairs are encouraged to discuss panel ideas with the Program Chairs before submitting a panel proposal.

A panel proposal should be submitted by the Panel Chairperson, who will be responsible for coordinating the panel. The proposal should include a brief summary of the topic to be covered and the names and affiliations of two or three panelists who have made a commitment to participate. The Program Committee reserves the right to modify panel proposals in order to complement other parts of the Conference program. A one-page description of accepted panels will be published in the Conference Proceedings.

Research-In-Progress

A new track is being introduced at ICIS'92 that will provide a forum for discussing research in progress that is related to the conference theme. Complete analysis of results will not be expected, although some preliminary results are necessary. Each paper that describes research in progress is limited to eleven pages: a one-page abstract and a ten-page paper that covers the following topics:

1. Research question(s) being addressed
2. Relevance of research to the conference theme or subthemes
3. Theoretical foundations
4. Research methodology
5. Challenges faced in conducting the research and approaches taken for addressing these issues
6. Preliminary results

Submitted research-in-progress papers will be refereed by the Program Committee. Papers will be evaluated on their relevance to the conference theme, the insights provided for IS researchers, and the potential for important findings. Reviews will be returned to the author(s). A one-page abstract of selected papers will be published in the proceedings.

Publication of Accepted Research Papers

All research papers accepted for ICIS will be published in full in the Conference *Proceedings*, copies of which will be provided to all attendees. According to the editorial policies or practices of *MIS Quarterly*, *Management Science*, *Information Systems Research*, and *Communications of the ACM*, publication of a paper in the ICIS *Proceedings* will not bar a revised version of the paper from consideration for publication in these journals. However, a revised version of the paper may not be published in another journal until after the Conference. Any paper submitted to a journal should indicate that an earlier version of the paper has been presented at ICIS.

Awards

Three awards of \$1,000 each will be given to the best research papers. Awards will be based on the quality of the research and its relevance to one or more of the stated conference subthemes.

Other Additions to Conference Program

In addition to refereed papers and panels, the program will consist of invited presentations and tutorials.

Instructions to Authors

Five copies of complete papers or panel proposals must be received no later than March 9, 1992. Diskettes and electronically transmitted papers will not be accepted. The body of a research paper, exclusive of references, must not exceed 5,000 words; the body of a paper describing research in progress, exclusive of references, must not exceed 2,000 words. Authors must indicate the exact word count of their paper on the title page. Research papers exceeding 5,000 words (approximately 25 typewritten, double-spaced pages of 200 words per page), exclusive of references, and research-in-progress papers exceeding 2,000 words (approximately ten typewritten, double-spaced pages of 200 words per page), exclusive of references and one-page abstract, will not be reviewed but instead will be automatically rejected. To facilitate the blind refereeing process, the author's name and affiliation should appear only on a separate title page along with a maximum of five keyword descriptors. The language of the Conference is English.

Authors whose papers are selected and panelists who are members of accepted panels are expected to register for the Conference. Research papers not accompanied by the completed and signed submission form included in this Call will be rejected and returned to the author(s). The author(s) retain copyright ownership of papers published in the ICIS *Proceedings*.
