



## Percentage OA journals of all newly founded scientific journals











## Copyright – the filter between journals and green OA



- Copyright policy of Palgrave McMillan, publisher of the *European Journal of Information Systems*, allows OA posting
  - of the version accepted for publication, following peer review,
     but prior to copy-editing by the publisher
  - on the author's own website or his institution's or funding body's online repository/archive
  - must be delayed until 24 months after first online publication
  - must be clearly identified as the author's post-peer-review, precopy-edit version and
  - a link must be provided to the definitive, published version on the journal's web site.

  - International Journal of Interoperability in Business Information Systems
  - Journal of Information, Information Technology and Organizations
  - Journal of Theoretical and Applied Electronic Commerce Research
- Publishers of top IS journals have rather restrictive copyright rules concerning repository copies
