This is to let you know about the success of the SIM Academic Workshop at SIM Connect LIVE on April 11-13, 2018 in Dallas, Texas. The goals of the SIM Academic + Practitioner Workshop at SIM Connect LIVE were to unite practitioners and researchers in leading the debate on the future of digital work and to share cutting-edge research that impacts future digital practice, while gaining feedback from practitioners to guide new research directions and opportunities.

The SIM Academic Workshop included:

- Looking Back – Acting Forward: Nine presentations by leading MISQE researchers, with discussants from the SIM IT leadership community.
- “Optimizing the Digital Workforce:” Ten presentations and feedback from SIM leaders on research abstracts and ideas from the Pre-ICIS and HICSS SIM Academic Workshops.
