## Message from the SIM CEO

The MISQE and SIM Academic Workshop will be held at the University of Copenhagen on Saturday. December 10. The theme of the Workshop is: Boards of Directors and the Governance of Digital Technology. Abstracts presented at this Workshop will be reviewed for publication in the MISQE Special Issue in December, 2023.

The Call for Papers cites:

The role that technology plays in an fundamentally has oraanization chanaed since computers were first deployed. Digital technologies are now shaping business models, defining customer experiences, driving intelligent automation, enabling new ways of working, and connecting ecosystems. As organizations navigated the Covid pandemic, their dependence on IT was very apparent; most organizations would not survive for long without their IT systems. This elevated role of technology raises significant risks.

Boards have a fiduciary responsibility to act in the best interests of the organization and its stakeholders. Their key purpose is to ensure the organization's sustainability and success by governing its affairs. Boards have very defined roles and responsibilities, often enshrined in legislation, including recruiting, supervising, evaluating, and compensating the CEO; providing the vision, mission, and goals of the organization; and monitoring and controlling risk.

The failure of digital technology investments can have a material impact on an organization, sometimes even bringing it to collapse. Cybersecurity and data breaches, critical project failures, and outdated infrastructure can cause serious operational problems and reputational damage. Technical debt, like financial debt, can limit an organization's strategic choices.

This important MISOE and SIM Academic Workshop will address the responsibilities of Board members for Digital Leadership. The Editors include:
